File Out FAFSA

Before we can determine your eligibility for any kind of financial aid, you must first fill out and submit the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#).

- ▶ FAFSA: <https://fafsa.ed.gov/>
- ▶ Start A New FAFSA or Return User (login)
- ▶ Please keep in mind that FAFSA means Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
- ▶ This will help you find funding to support your college courses.
- ▶ Because you file for FAFSA does not mean you are automatically funded.
- ▶ You can be eligible if: High school diploma or GED certificate.
- ▶ Valid Social Security Number
- ▶ Valid citizen of the US, a permanent US resident with a valid Permanent Resident Card, or a US National. In other cases, you may receive financial aid if you are an eligible non-citizen.
- ▶ If the student is a male between the ages of 18-25, they must agree to let the FAFSA register them with the US Selective Service, or the must already be registered.

FAFSA PRO

- ▶ Gather all necessary information.....
- ▶ Know which colleges/universities you may be attending.....
- ▶ File for FAFSA as soon as possible after January 1st.....
- ▶ Some financial is disbursed on a first-come, first serve basis....
- ▶ IRS data retrieval tool.....
- ▶ Free help...Free chat on FAFSA website for questions. Local campuses also have advisors and financial aid coordinators available for assistance.

Login Options

The FSA ID, which consists of a user-created username and password, replaced the PIN effective May, 2015. It allows users to electronically access personal information on Federal Student Aid Web sites as well as electronically sign a FAFSA.

Select one:

Enter your FSA ID (only the student should log in with an FSA ID),

Or

Enter the student's name, Social Security Number and date of birth. (You may have to enter your FSA ID later in

Answer all questions and follow prompts to complete your FAFSA.

- ▶ Once your FAFSA has been processed, you may:
- ▶ Apply for or receive grants if you qualify,
- ▶ Apply for scholarships if you qualify, or
- ▶ Apply for loans if you qualify.

Grants

(Examples)

Grants are usually based on your financial need and do not have to be repaid as long as you comply with their stipulations. Most grants are designed for undergraduate students. Here are some examples.

LOANS

- ▶ Loans: loan for college costs is money that must be repaid. Loans represent a major source of assistance you should consider as you try to meet the full costs of your education. Educational loans generally have long-term repayment schedules, offer low interest rates, often have provisions for deferring payments and may offer additional benefits related to financial need.
- ▶ Before you borrow money for college, you should understand the specific conditions and requirements regarding disbursements, deferments and repayment options. If you fail to meet the conditions of the promissory note, you may be denied all federal aid, lose your good credit rating and be unable to borrow money to buy a car or home. Loan terms are subject to change at any time
